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


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The Upper Rhine Region

- From Southern Palatinate to North-Western Switzerland
- Total area: 21.517 km²
- 5.9 mill. inhabitants: 30 % in F,
- 23 % in CH, 47 % in D
- 90.000 commuters
- 167.000 students
- 167 research facilities more than in Silicon Valley
- 200 billion Euros GDP
- over 35 years of experience in CBC

- migration and displaced people




After the 2nd World War:

Levels of cross-border the Upper Rhine region



cooperation (cbc) in

- 1975: inter-governmental Commission (D/F/CH), Bonn Agreement
- **1991:** Conference of the Upper Rhine, central information and coordination board, interstate treaty and revision of the Bonn Agreement in **2000**
- Article 1: In order to promote cross-border co-operation, the Parties establish a joint Governmental Commission for the Upper Rhine (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission").




•Article 3: In order to fulfil its tasks, the Commission relies on a regional commission, named the "Franco-German-Swiss Conference on the Upper Rhine ".

•Article 4: The Commission shall in particular be responsible for dealing with those matters of cross-border co-operation, which cannot be dealt with by the Upper Rhine Conference.





Fishing licence

- Expert commission "Fishery"
- Rhine designates the national borders
- Different legal set-ups concerning: fishing in the Rhine and closed seasons, required formation for a fishing licence
- ⇒ Problems: a French fisherman was arrested by the German water police for not having the required fishing licence
- ⇒ Need to create a common fishing licence
- \Rightarrow Recognized by all parties
- \Rightarrow Common training courses

Offenburg

- **1991: INTERREG** as instrument for implementation
- The **Upper Rhine Council**: founded in 1997, tri-national "Parliament", 71 elected representatives from Alsace, Baden, South-Palatinate and Northwestern Switzerland. The Council facilitates the sharing of information and increases dialogue between elected representatives



DER OBERRHEINRAT

Network of Upper Rhine Cities: founded in 2002 because of the polycentric structure of the Upper Rhine Region; works as an information and cooperation platform and concentrates the forces of the member cities

- Will to expand and encourage the co-operation in the economic as well as in the scientific sector




