What the Council of Europe stands for?

- Aim of the Council of Europe (1949): to achieve greater unity between its members for the purpose of safeguarding and realising the ideals and principles which are their common heritage and facilitating their economic and social progress
- Means: by discussing questions of common concern and by concluding agreements and common action in economic, social, cultural, scientific, legal and administrative matters
- Outputs: conventions, recommendations, reports, sharing of best practice, toolkits, communities of practice

Role of local and regional authorities

- The Council of Europe consists of "a committee of representatives of governments and of a consultative assembly"
- Europe consists of states, regions, local authorities and citizens
- The Council of Europe has given a stand and voice to local authorities in 1957
- The Standing Conference of Local Authorities of Europe which became the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of Europe (1994)
- ▶ The Charter of Local Self-Government (1985) and its Additional Protocol (2009)
- The Madrid Outline Convention on Transfrontier Cooperation of Territorial Authorities or Communities (1980) and its three Protocols (1995, 1998, 2009)

Bringing territories and populations closer

- Promoting cooperation between territorial authorities or communities across the borders – as if it were within the same country (Madrid Outline Convention) even if geographically distant (Protocol No 2)
- Facilitating the conclusion of agreements and the setting up of cooperation bodies (Additional Protocol) including fully-fledged legal entities (Protocol No 3)
- Understanding and removing obstacles to cross-border cooperation (Recommendation (2005) of the Committee of Ministers, conclusions of the Utrecht Conference 2009, Handbook 2013, EDEN Database 2015)
